



## Idaho Industrial Commission (IIC) EDI Claims R3.1 Announcement

### **Important Reminder: Trading Partner (Direct Reporters) and EDI Vendor Testing will begin soon!**

April 4, 2022

This notification provides information regarding the upcoming testing period for IIC Trading Partners (Direct SFTP) and EDI Vendors which will begin on June 30, 2022.

There is no need to create a new IIC Trading Partner Profile (TPP) or update existing profiles prior to testing. However, if reporting changes to the Sender, Receiver, Insurer, Claims Administrator, or transmission protocol, please go to <https://iicedi.info/register> to make changes.

EDI Vendors and Trading Partners submitting claims data directly are required to complete the Test Plan. The IIC Test Plan is available at <https://iicedi.info/impl-info>. **Any Direct SFTP trading partner or EDI Vendor who has not completed and passed the FROI/SROI testing will not be advanced to production.**

Exceptions: No testing is required for IIC Web Entry filers using wcPrism. In some cases, if a Trading Partner is using an EDI Vendor, the EDI Vendor will coordinate and/or perform the testing on behalf of the Trading Partner.

Please note the following important information regarding the incoming test files:

- Must contain proper information consistent with the approved method on the TPP
- The Test/Production Indicator (DN0104) located in position 82 of the Header Record should be set to 'T' for all testing

IIC will return acknowledgements to the Trading Partner during the testing phase(s). Processing is typically completed the same day, but no longer than 48 hours after the data is submitted, with consideration for test file format issues or other unexpected processing issues.

Testing concludes November 23, 2022, and the implementation date for EDI Claims Release 3.1 is December 1, 2022.

As a reminder, data is deemed of high-test quality if it correctly represents the real-world construct to which it refers. It is recommended that as much as possible, actual FROI and SROI data be used to meet the FROI and SROI testing requirements.

IIC will be utilizing a policy validation tool which will be implemented with the migration to EDI Claims Release 3.1. **The FROI test file must contain true policy data for Insurer FEIN (DN0006) and a related Policy Number Identifier (DN0028) to substantiate the verification process.**
