

Idaho Industrial Commission (IIC) Announcement

IIC EDI Claims Release 3.0 Trading Partner Tables, Version 1.7, Update to Idaho Claims EDI R3 Test Plan and Updated Reporting Timelines- Available for Download

IIC has posted the EDI Claims Release 3.0 Trading Partner Tables, Version 1.7 that are immediately available for download at <u>https://iicedi.info/requirements</u>. The 'Requirement Tables Change Log' describes the changes to IIC's Requirements.

Highlight of Changes on V1.7:

- FROI Conditions: Modified technical condition for DN0005 Jurisdiction Claim Number to add MTC UI.
- Value Table: Removed 'C' (Overpayment) from DN0126 Benefit Credit Code.
- The cut-off for receipt of data from IIC Trading Partners for EDI R3.0 Claims will be 2:00 AM EST. Please review the Implementation Guide for additional details.

Highlights of Changes to the Idaho Test Plan:

Based on trading partner questions and test data received so far, the Idaho Industrial Commission has amended the Idaho Industrial Commission (IIC) – EDI Claims Release 3.0 Test Plan. Please read through the Idaho Industrial Commission (IIC) – EDI Claims Release 3.0 Test Plan.

In general, Idaho would like to emphasize that these Test Stages are an opportunity for EDI Vendors and Trading Partners to ensure their systems are supplying FROI and SROI data which meet Idaho filing requirements and result in minimal rejections when mandatory data reporting of EDI Claims Release 3.0 begins in Idaho on November 4, 2017. Idaho would like to see that test data quality and data integrity also be considered. With regards to who is required to test, Idaho differentiates between Trading Partners using an EDI Vendor versus Trading Partners transmitting directly (Direct SFTP). Trading Partners using an EDI Vendor are further differentiated based on who is performing the data edits – the EDI Vendor or the Trading Partner. Additional MTC sequencing has been added to the FROI test plan. The SROI test data so far has not contained all the variable segments. To be fully confident that SROI data will pass edits in production, EDI Vendors and Trading Partners must test a variety of SROI MTCs containing MTC-appropriate variable segment data.
